In **Oak Class**, we have been learning about Floella Benjamin's journey to England from Trinidad as part of the Windrush Generation. This has included descriptive and diary writing. In maths, we have been learning about number, up to and including 6/7 digit numbers. Our topic of Crime and Punishment has been engaging and interesting, looking at timelines and Roman punishments. The Roman Legacy is all around us in many different ways. In science, we have been looking at inheritance and evolution, including looking at family photos and recognising similarities. Thank you for all the wonderful family photos we have received."

In the **Acorn class**, the children have been working incredibly hard! Our English work has looked at a book called 'Meesha Makes Friends' and has looked at diary entries, verbs and expanding our sentences. The maths work has looked at place value including 'one more, one less' and 'partitioning numbers into hundreds, tens and ones' we have used place value counters, base 10, ten frames and part wholes to support our learning with this. Science has started with looking at survival and this week we have looked at what we need to survive. Timelines has been a focus for our Topic work this week and in particular we looked at Florence Nightingale and plotted some key dates on a timeline.
