Acorn Class News and Learning

The acorn class have had a fantastic start to the term. In English we have recapped some grammar and spelling and taken a close look at handwriting. In Maths, the children have made a strong start using Power Maths, specifically looking at place value. Our topic work has started by looking at the UK and the different countries and cities within. The children made a brilliant start to the work on rivers, where at Carding Mill Valley they enjoyed measuring the width, depth and speed of the river. They also completed a small study on the rocks in the stream, looking at the size and shape of them. They enjoyed looking for different creatures in the stream and found freshwater shrimps, worms and mayfly nymphs.

The class now have spellings that they can practice at home. Spelling tests will be done in class on Thursdays and new spellings will be sent home on Thursday afternoon.

We have had a very busy start to the year. In English we have started to read the Iron Man and been learning about description, noun phrases and using speech


Children's Voice
